This answer key is provided as a guide for the corrector. Answers should be graded on basic content rather than specific wording in most cases. Please refer to the KJV, NIV or other versions of the Bible as an additional reference, including the version used by the student, if possible.

CHAPTER 1

1. Reuben, Simeon, Levi, Judah, Issachar, Zebulun, Benjamin, Dan, Naphtali, Gad, Asher
2. Joseph's generation passed on, but the children of Israel were fruitful. They multiplied and the land was filled with them.
3. persecuted them and made slaves out of them - afflicted them with heavy burdens
4. the more they afflicted them, the more they multiplied and the Egyptians were grieved
5. they were made to serve with rigour, and they made their lives bitter with hard bondage - all manner of service

- 176. the feast of harvest (first fruits)
- 177. the feast of ingathering, at the end of the year when harvest was over
- 178. His angel
- 179. beware of him, obey his voice, provoke him not, and he would be a great benefit to them
- 180. not to serve them or bow down to them, nor do after their works; to utterly overthrow them and break down their images. Not to make any covenants with the people or their gods.
- 181. to take sickness away from the midst of them
- 182. by sending his fear upon them and cause them to flee before the Israelites, that He would send hornets to drive them out, He would drive them out gradually, little by little as the Israelites increased
