This answer key is provided as a guide for the corrector. Answers should be graded on basic content rather than specific wording in most cases. Please refer to the KJV, NIV or other versions of the Bible as an additional reference, including the version used by the student, if possible.

CHAPTER 1

1. Jacob
2. Joseph's generation passed on, but the children of Israel were fruitful. They multiplied and the land was filled with them.
3. Made slaves out of them
4. The more they afflicted them, the more they multiplied
5. They made their lives bitter with hard bondage
6. That they should be killed

CHAPTER 2
